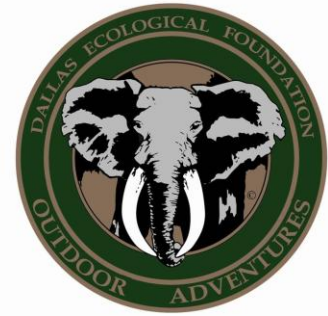

NASP Equipment Grants
