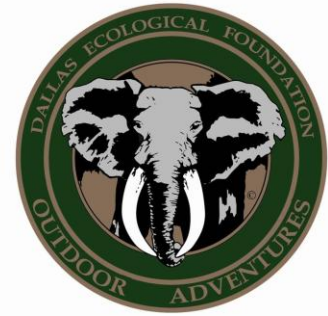

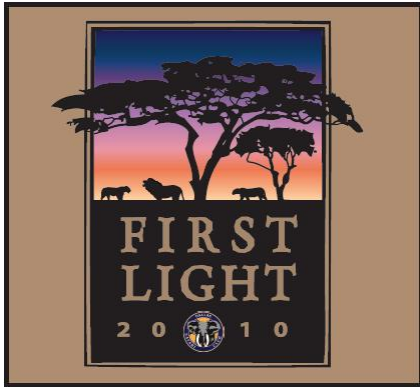

5th Annual State Scholarship Championship

When: February 26, 2010. Participating schools will select or be assigned (as space permits) a shooting time and flight: Flight #1-9:00 am; Flight #2-10:00 am; Flight #3-11:00 am; Flight #4-1:00 pm; Flight #5-2:00 pm; Flight #6-3:00 pm. Shooters must be ready to march to their lane assignment 15 minutes before their assigned shooting time. To meet this line-up time requirement, schools should arrive at the tournament registration desk at least 1 hour before their shooting time.

Who:

- This tournament is the annual "culminating event" for schools participating in the NASP. The basic foundation of the NASP is the in-school archery unit. Therefore, schools that teach archery as part of the in-school curriculum are qualified to compete in this tournament. This tournament is not for schools or clubs that offer archery only as an after-school activity.
- Teams or Individuals will register in either the *Primary (K-3rd)*, *Elementary (4th-6th grade)*, Middle (7-8th grade), or High School (9-12th grade) Division. A student in a lower grade may shoot for a team in his or her school district that is in a higher Division but not vice versa. Schools that cannot field a team may have students compete for Individual awards. *Primary (K-3rd) division is only for Individual archers, team awards are not given in the Primary division.*
- Schools are encouraged to bring adult volunteers to assist.
- Team: NASP archery teams must contain 16-24 students, at least 5 of which must be of the opposite gender. Team members must be determined at the time of registration. Substitutions may be made at Check In for no shows. No substitutions or changes may be made after the tournament begins.

- The registration fee is \$20 per student, **payable in one check for total of all students**, to the Texas Archery In Schools Program postmarked by Jan 29, 2010.

Tournament Rules: Tournament Rules will be updated each year by August 1st.

Format: Qualified Equipment:

1. NASP Genesis compound bow (target colors or camouflage).
2. Full-length, size 1820 aluminum arrows. *Arrows will be provided.*

3. Only plastic vanes are permitted.
4. No sights, tape, marks, or other modifications to the bow that may, in the opinion of the judges be used as a sighting aid. Any marks placed on the riser, above the grip of the bow, must be removed or the bow will be disqualified. If such a bow is used during the tournament, the archer will be disqualified. If a bow must be numbered or otherwise identified by the school or shooter with tape, such markings should be on the lower limb or the bow below the grip. Black electricians tape may be used to cover marks on the riser. *It will be the coach's responsibility to check their bows for marks on the face of the sight window before placing the bows on the bow racks.* After bows are placed on the bow racks, range officials will inspect them before shooting begins.
5. Archers are encouraged to bring their own bows. A small number of loaner bows will be available.
6. Finger tabs, "no-glove" string attachments, gloves, and armguards may be used.
7. The use of mechanical release aids or stabilizers will not be allowed.
8. The use of draw stops of any type will not be allowed.
9. Sims vibration dampening devices may be attached to the limbs of the bow.
10. **Brassnock locators are prohibited. Only tied string locators or heat-shrink locators will be allowed.**
11. *Wrist or finger slings will be allowed but must be attached by a means other than using a bolt in the stabilizer accessory hole.*

Range Set-Up:

1. Targets will be 80 cm FITA face with 10 scoring rings.
2. Target butts will be placed directly on the floor similar to the height of school butts.
3. Target line will be approximately 6 feet in front of the target butts.
4. There will be 10 and 15 meter shooting lines.
5. The waiting line will be at least 10 feet beyond the 15 meter shooting line.
6. Spectator seats will be placed as close as possible behind the waiting line.
7. Approximately 50 to 60, 5 foot wide shooting lanes will be used with 2 archers assigned per lane per flight.
8. Each shooting lane will have one "A" and one "B" shooter assigned per shooting time.
9. Each of the lane's shooters will be from different schools.

Competition Format

1. Each archer will shoot 1 practice end of 5 arrows at 10 meters and then shoot 3 scoring ends of 5 arrows (15 arrows total) at 10 meters.
2. *Each archer will shoot 1 practice end of 5 arrows at 15 meters and then shoot 3 scoring ends of 5 arrows (15 arrows total) at 15 meters.*
3. Both "A" and "B" shooters will shoot and the score and retrieve arrows together.
4. Archers will have 2 minutes to shoot each 5-arrow end. An alert will be provided near the conclusion of each end. For tournament purposes, no time clock will be in view of the archers.

Scoring:

1. Adults will be assigned to shooting lanes to assist students if needed.
2. *Each student archer will call their arrow scores while their lane partner records the scores and then switch.*
3. *All arrows must be scored before any arrow or the target's face is touched by anyone to avoid affecting the score of un-scored arrows remaining in the target.*
4. Arrows touching or cutting a scoring ring line will be given the higher score.
5. Judges will inspect equipment for compliance before shooting begins.
6. Judges will call disputed arrows.
7. Judges will assure adult scorers and archers sign the score card before leaving the range.
8. Judges will escort archers who need to shoot bounce-outs to the appropriate lanes.
9. *Coaches will gather score cards, check them for accuracy and signatures, and deliver to a judge. Coaches finding errors will alert a judge before making any changes to the score card.*
10. Judges will deliver signed score cards to the scoring table at the end of shooting times.
11. All tie's for 1-3rd places will be decided by the # of X's, further ties will be decided by the # of 10's.
12. Team scores are the summation of the team's highest 12 individual scores – with at least 4 of both genders.

Awards: Texas State Scholarship Championship Awards:

1. A team award will be presented for the school with the most participants.
2. Individual awards will be presented to the top three boys and girls in each of the three age divisions.
3. 1 team trophy is awarded to each of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place teams in each division.
4. Scholarships will be given to the top three boys and girls in the high school division. (\$7,000 in scholarships was awarded in 2008!)
5. *TX-NASP representatives will visit each winning school to present awards following the tournament.*

Frequently Asked Questions

What is attending school? The attending school is the school in which the student is enrolled.

What is a division? There are four divisions in this archery tournament; Primary (K-3rd), Elementary (4th-6th), Middle (7th-8th) and High School (9th-12th.) Individual and team competitions will occur within these four divisions.

What is a flight? A flight is a shooting time. There will be four shooting times or flights during this tournament, Flight 1 @ 9:00 a.m., Flight 2 @ 10:00 a.m., Flight 3 @ 11:00 a.m., Flight 4 @ 1:00 p.m., Flight 5 @ 2:00 p.m., and Flight 6 @ 3:00 p.m.

What is a flight preference? A flight preference is your choice of one of the four flight times 9:00, 10:00, 11:00, 1:00, 2:00 or 3:00. You can add your entire school to a single flight preference or you may add your school to different flights.

What if my Flight preference is unavailable? If your Flight Preference is not available we will attempt to honor your next Flight Preferences.

What do I do if two shooters will be using the same bow? If two shooters are using the same bow, they should be assigned to the different flights.

What are “shooter A” and “shooter B”? Within a lane set, there are two students shooting, shooter A and shooter B, from different schools. In other words, there are two students per target, an “A” and a “B.”

What if my team has one or more members shooting up on a higher division team? For example, a 5th grade student "up" on a Middle (7-8th grade) team. This student will be considered a middle school team member and an elementary individual. This student could win a team award in the middle school division and an individual award in the elementary division.

Why must a team contain 16-24 team members if only 12 members' scores will be added to constitute the team score for the competition? The NASP promotes inclusion of many students of all genders and abilities. By requiring teams to have more members than are scored, it is hoped that schools will include members on the teams that might not otherwise be able to participate. In other words, a team member whose score might not be high enough to include in the team's score, won't reduce the team's final ranking.
